based on the view that curricula for young children should involve thinking and planning for everything that can contribute to child development and the teacher s relationship with the child and the family this book details a comprehensive interactive curriculum for infants from birth to 18 months following an introductory chapter presenting the curriculum model chapters 2 through 7 each address a major developmental challenge separating from parents connecting with school and teacher relating to self and others communicating with others moving around and expressing feelings within each chapter the book presents innovations in 1 observation assessment including suggestions for ensuring developmentally appropriate practice and giving feedback to parents about developmental growth 2 child development explaining the underlying theory of principles or content knowledge 3 interactive experiences listing the types of experiences that teachers must observe plan
